PRESENTATION

Those being Confirmed by making affirmation of their baptism gather with the minister at the font. A congregational representative will note briefly the occasion for this gathering.

Denice Smith:

I present to you Hudson Juel, who has completed Confirmation, and been approved by the church council, and desire to make public affirmation of his baptism by participating in this rite of confirmation.

The minister continues with prayer.

Let us pray. Merciful God, we thank you for Hudson, whom you have made your own by water and the Word in baptism. You have called him to yourself, enlightened him with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished him in the community of faith. Uphold your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ.

Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The minister addresses those being confirmed. The assembly stands.

Hudson, I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? If so, answer, "I renounce them."

Hudson: I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Hudson: I renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Hudson: I renounce them.

The minister addresses the candidates and the assembly.

And you, people of First Lutheran Church, I ask you to confess your faith, the faith into which we baptize.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM

The minister addresses those being confirmed.

You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,
to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,
and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

If so, I call on you to respond, "I do, and I ask God to help and guide me."

Hudson: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

The minister addresses the assembly.

People of God, do you promise to support Hudson, and pray for him in his life in Christ?

We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

The minister prays for God's blessing.

Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life.

The minister and family will lay both hands on the confirmand and say:

Stir up in Hudson the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

Amen.

Those who are confirmed face the assembly. A representative of the congregation addresses the assembly.

Denice Smith:

Let us rejoice with Hudson, a fellow member of the body of Christ, and now a confirmed member of First Lutheran Church.

We rejoice with you in the life of baptism. Together we will give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world.

Denice Smith:

It is appropriate to welcome this new member with applause, as he returns to his seat.

* Gospel: Luke 20:27-38

²⁷ Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to him ²⁸ and asked him a question: “Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man’s brother dies leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. ²⁹ Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman and died childless; ³⁰ then the second ³¹ and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. ³² Finally the woman also died. ³³ In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her.”

³⁴ Jesus said to them, “Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage, ³⁵ but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. ³⁶ Indeed, they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. ³⁷ And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. ³⁸ Now he is God not of the dead but of the living, for to him all of them are alive.”

Last week's Noisy Offering is giving \$215.95 to the Pine River Area Food Shelf. Thank you for your generous giving!

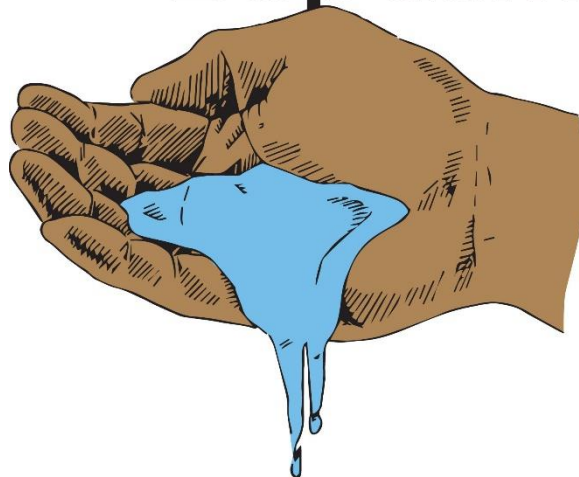

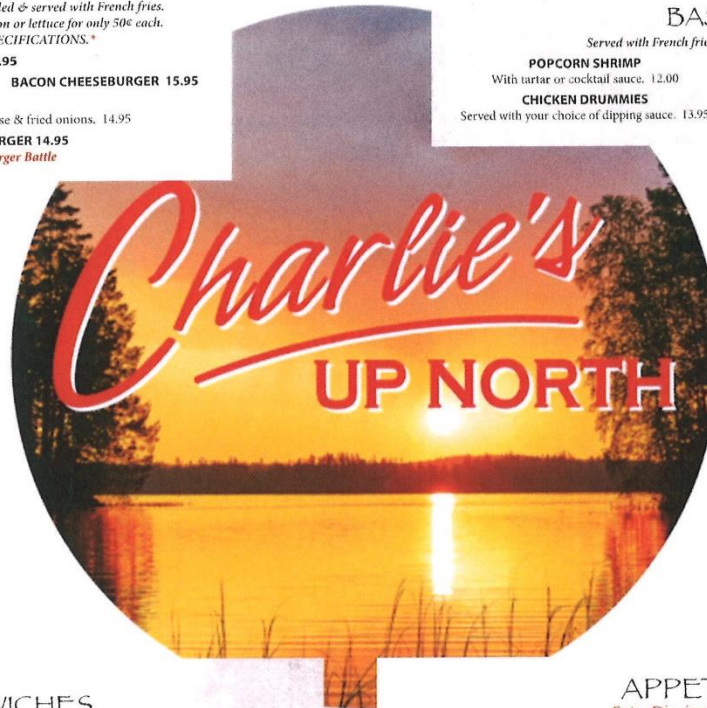
