Epiphany: Light has come!

The festival of Epiphany is always on January 6th (thirteen days after Christmas) and the season of the church year that follows is about the unwrapping of the Father's gift to the world of his only-begotten Son and this is called Epiphany a Greek word that means "To be made visible." If Christmas was about Jesus as fully human, a baby son born to Mary and laid in a manger. Then, Epiphany is about Jesus who is fully divine, the Son of God.

On the first Sunday after the Epiphany, we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord Sunday. On the last Sunday of Epiphany, before Ash Wednesday, we have Transfiguration Sunday. These 2 Sundays bracket the season of Epiphany because they most clearly reveal who Jesus is: The divine Son of God. At both moments, the voice of God the Father speaks from heaven, declaring Jesus divinity... "This is my Son!"

Epiphany is the second-oldest festival of the Christian church, only Easter is an older observance. Originally, Epiphany celebrated 4 different events... all on one day! These events were the birth of Jesus, the baptism of our Lord, Jesus first miracle, and the visit of the wise men. Each of these is a revelation of God to humanity.

Eventually, the celebration of Christ's birth was separated out and became Christmas twelve days prior to the Epiphany, so that the season of Christmas began with the revelation to Israel represented by the shepherds at Bethlehem and then ended with the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles represented by the wise men. Epiphany is therefore sometimes called "The Gentiles' Christmas."

Over the centuries, the two other celebrations were separated as well. The baptism of our Lord moved to the first Sunday after the Epiphany and the commemoration of Jesus first miracle, the wedding at Cana moved to the second Sunday after Epiphany!

Epiphany: Light has Come! Is this February's theme focusing on how Jesus is "made visible" and "made known" to the people. Light is a perfect theme for the Epiphany Season as one needs light to see! The first two Sundays this month are about Jesus as a gift or present in the presentation of our Lord and Jesus presented at the temple. The latter two Sundays reveal this gift as love! The levelling of the playing field on the landscape of love and loving all, yes, even our enemies! Jesus comes to us during this month of February as a gift in this present time, bringing the much-needed gifts of warming light and love!

Call to Order:

Denice Smith called the meeting to order.

Devotions:

Denice Smith presented the monthly devotion. Anne Holm will give the devotion in February.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Hans gave an oral report looking ahead to 2025. "A Place for You" will be the Lenten Theme. There will be a brief presentation at the close of each Holden Evening Prayer Lenten Service.

Approval of Minutes:

Motion by Anne Holm to approve the November 2024 written council minutes, seconded by Melanie Lindquist. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

Cora, Hohnstadt, noted that the Marian Chindvall Memorial Fund has been completely used and the Margaret Jorgenson Memorial Fund is now at \$76.50. These memorials have been used to provide funds for the WOW program and meals. There is a WOW donation/fee account that will now be used to pay WOW expenses. The remaining \$48.00 owed for Christmas poinsettias will be paid from the Worship and Music Budget. The council members were made aware of the increase in the yearly Plunkett's bill and the payment for repair of water leakage issues in the men's bathrooms. Motion by Anne Holm to approve the treasurer's report. Seconded by Art Schmidt, motion carried.

The council was made aware that the guest organist/pianist fee is \$150.00. The fee follows the fee schedule for weddings/funerals held at First Lutheran.

Discussion was held about the snow removal and shoveling. The Council President will contact the shoveling employee to note our 9:00 am church service start time and to shovel front side-walk if it has not been plowed.

<u>New Business</u>

A 2025 Audit Committee will be formed following the constitution guidelines.

The scheduled April Church Council Meeting falls on Easter Sunday. Council members agreed to hold no meeting in April.

Lenten Soup Suppers will begin on Ash Wednesday, March 5. There will be a sign up sheet in the narthex for members to form weekly "Soup Groups". Each group of four families will set up/ clean up and provide the food for our soup suppers. WOW will continue to meet during Lent except for the school's Spring Break (April 19) and early out day. (April 9).

Following the church constitution directions, the Executive Committee of the council will set a date to do the yearly review of the First Lutheran Church Constitution.

Bibles will be presented to students on Sunday, February 23, 2025.

Cora noted there were 6 zoom participants today.

What Have We Done Well? What Are Our Hopes for 2025? These questions were discussed briefly and will be a part of each church council meeting. We will vision for our congregation.

The Lions Community Blood Drive, March 19, 2025 will be announced in the church bulletin.

The next Church Council Meeting will be Sunday, February 16, 2025, 10:00 am in person.


